Call for Applications: Become a “Rebuild Ukraine Ambassador”

Do you want to help shape a resilient, sustainable, and European future for Ukraine? Are you passionate about recovery, civic engagement, cultural resilience, and youth-led policy ideas?

The Rebuild Ukraine Ambassadors Programme, led by the [European Youth Parliament \(EYP\)](#), empowers young people from Ukraine and across Europe to contribute to discussions on Ukraine’s reconstruction and long-term recovery.

Now entering its 4th edition, the programme will select up to 30 new and returning Ambassadors. Participants will take part in digital workshops, the Rebuild Ukraine Lab in Berlin, and an optional study visit to Lviv, working together to develop youth-led policy ideas for Ukraine’s recovery.

About the Rebuild Ukraine Ambassadors Programme

Launched in 2022 by the European Youth Parliament, the [Rebuild Ukraine Ambassadors Programme](#) gives young people a platform to contribute to conversations on Ukraine’s reconstruction and long-term recovery. It brings together Ukrainian and non-Ukrainian participants from across Europe to exchange perspectives, learn from experts, and explore ideas for a sustainable, democratic, and inclusive recovery.

At the heart of the programme is the Rebuild Ukraine Lab, an in-person event that builds on EYP’s peer-led, non-formal education methodology. At the Lab, participants work in small, internationally mixed groups, supported by peer facilitators, to exchange perspectives, explore key questions around Ukraine’s recovery, and together develop ideas and recommendations. This format creates space for structured discussion, intercultural exchange, and consensus-building, while keeping young people at the centre of the process.

Previous editions of the programme have taken place in Warsaw, Lviv, Berlin, and Braşov, with the Ambassadors continuing their work through public events, exchanges, youth forums, and meetings with stakeholders across Europe. The 2026 edition will build on this by opening space for new topics, participants, and perspectives.

Selected participants may also have the opportunity to join a study visit to Lviv (optional), connecting the Lab discussions with civil society perspectives and realities on the ground in Ukraine.

Why join?

Ukraine’s recovery is not only about rebuilding what has been destroyed. It is also an opportunity to rethink systems, strengthen resilience, support democratic development, and ensure that young people are part of shaping the country’s future.

By joining the Rebuild Ukraine Ambassadors Programme, you will:

- Become part of a youth-led European network working on Ukraine’s recovery
- Exchange perspectives with young people from Ukraine and across Europe
- Learn from experts, civil society actors, and practitioners
- Develop ideas on reconstruction, resilience, civic engagement, and European cooperation
- Contribute to Europe-wide ideation and strategic thinking on Ukraine’s future
- Take part in the **Rebuild Ukraine Lab 2026 from 15 to 18 October in Berlin**
- Have the opportunity to join a study visit to Lviv (optional)



- Strengthen your skills in teamwork, communication, advocacy, and public engagement
- Contribute to a one-year Ambassador mandate with space for continued advocacy after the Lab

To make participation as accessible as possible, selected participants will receive support including:

- Travel reimbursement
- Accommodation during the in-person programme components
- Meals during the in-person programme components
- Additional accessibility and inclusion support may be available to help people facing financial, geographic, disability-related, or other barriers to participation. Please reach out if you would like to discuss any additional assistance you may need.

What will you do?

As a Rebuild Ukraine Ambassador, you will take part in a one-year mandate that begins with preparatory meetings and workshops, continues with the Rebuild Ukraine Lab, and extends into advocacy and outreach activities.

You will:

- Prepare for and attend the **Rebuild Ukraine Lab in Berlin [15-18 October 2026]**
- Work with other participants to explore key questions around Ukraine's recovery in different thematic clusters
- Contribute to the development of shared ideas, recommendations, or other programme outcomes
- Take part in advocacy and outreach activities after the Lab, including meetings with decision-makers and politicians
- Help share youth perspectives on Ukraine through EYP channels, events, and public exchanges
- Optionally join the study visit to Lviv [4 days between 31 August to 4 September 2026, exact dates TBD]

Eligibility

We are looking for motivated young people who are interested in Ukraine's sustainable recovery and willing to contribute to a one-year Ambassador mandate.

We value diversity and welcome applications from people of all backgrounds, regardless of gender, ethnic or social background, religion or belief, disability, sexual orientation, or gender identity.

You are eligible to apply if you:

- Have a strong interest in Ukraine's recovery, reconstruction, and European future
- Can attend the Rebuild Ukraine Lab in Berlin **[15-18 October 2026]**
- Availability to commit time between July and October 2026 for preparatory activities and participation in online workshops
- Are open to research, discussion, teamwork, and public engagement
- Are willing to collaborate with participants from different backgrounds
- Have experience engaging with complex topics and are comfortable translating discussions into concrete outputs
- Are ready to contribute to advocacy and outreach after the Lab
- Are reliable and responsive, including through timely communication, meeting deadlines, and active engagement
